It was these four principles that the Buddha came to understand during his meditation under the bodhi tree. The Four Noble Truths - The First Noble Truth - The Second Noble Truth. The Four Aryan (or Noble) Truths are perhaps the most basic formulation of the Buddha's teaching. They are expressed as follows: 1. All existence is dukkha. These four truths are called noble because they liberate us from suffering. They are the Buddha's basic teaching, encapsulating the entire. The Four Noble Truths. A common, sloppy rendering of the Truths tells us that life is suffering; suffering is caused by greed; suffering ends when we stop being greedy; the way to do that is to follow something called the Eightfold Path. In a more formal setting, the Truths read: The truth of suffering (dukkha). The Four Noble Truths comprise the essence of Buddha's teachings, though they leave much left unexplained. They are the truth of suffering, the truth of the cause of suffering, the truth of the end of suffering, and the truth of the path that leads to the end of suffering.
